

# **GODOWSKY IS BITTEN BY DOG IN PASSING CAR**

## **Animal Tears Lip of Pianist As He Stands on Curb in Chicago Street.**

**CHICAGO, Oct. 3.**—Leopold Godowsky, pianist and composer, left Chicago for Rochester, N. Y., today following an unusual attack by a large police dog in which the musician suffered a bitten lower lip.

Mr. Godowsky was standing on the north curb of Michigan Avenue, at Adams Street yesterday evening, waiting to cross the street to the south, when a sedan turned from Michigan Avenue into Adams Street. A dog sat at a rear open window of the car.

Just as the automobile came abreast of Mr. Godowsky the dog reached out and snapped at him, tearing the pianist's lower lip.

The automobile did not stop and it is not known whether the driver was aware of the occurrence.

Mr. Godowsky was taken into the gas building where a physician dressed the wound and gave him an anti-rabies injection.

Three stitches were taken in the lacerated lip. Mr. Godowsky checked out of his hotel with Mrs. Godowsky this morning.

The pianist planned to continue treatments upon his arrival in Rochester, in view of the danger of infection.

### **Lord Duveen Arrives.**
