

GODOWSKY UTTERS KIND WORD ON JAZZ

Will Use It in Composition on
This Country, He Says, Re-
turning on Reliance.

MEADER ALSO ON BOARD

So Is the First American Woman to
Win Medical Degree in Berlin—
Liner America Docks.

George Meader, tenor of the Metropolitan Opera Company, and Leopold Godowsky, pianist and composer, were passengers who returned here yesterday on the United American liner Reliance. Mr. Godowsky's return was hastened by the serious illness of his wife. He came back with kind words for jazz, explaining that it was his intention to incorporate a jazz theme in a new "travelogue musical picture of America."

"Jazz music," said Mr. Godowsky, "is a revelation in rhythm. I mean the right sort and not the worst sort. George Gershiwin in his jazz rhapsody has expressed what I mean by the use of jazz as a classic motif."

Another passenger on the Reliance was Dr. Ella Fishberg of 170 Central Park South, who was the first American woman to graduate in medicine at the University of Berlin.

Others on the incoming ship were Otto D. Schafer and Fritz W. Hartmann, German bankers; Captain George C. Schafer of the United States Navy, who has been on a forty days' leave abroad, and R. B. F. Randolph, formerly of the Guaranty Trust Company, who is interested in a plan for the world-wide financing of the motion picture industry.

The Reliance brought 187 first class passengers, 204 second class and 67 third class.

The America, of the United States Lines, docked at Pier 4, Hoboken, with a passenger list including Edward R. Hardy, the youthful prodigy who entered Columbia at the age of 12 and graduated three years later. He has been on a visit to England and Ireland with his father, Professor Hardy of New York University. He announced that he would take his master's degree at Columbia and then enter a theological seminary. His ambition is to be ordained at 20.

Another passenger on the America was P. W. A. Armbrister, Treasurer of the Bahama Islands.

Mildred Dillings, harpist, returned from a European concert tour. Miss Eleanor Rogers, an American soprano, singing with La Scala Opera Company in Milan, arrived for a short visit. Hardesty Johnson, Erwyn Mutch, Floyd Townsley and Sigurd Nelson, who compose the de Reszke singers, returned from a concert tour.
