

GODOWSKY'S SON WEDS A FORMER SHOW GIRL

**Harvard Student Married to
Yvonne E. Hughes in Harrison,
N. Y., by Justice of the Peace.**

GREENWICH, Conn., Feb. 15.—Gordon Godowsky, Harvard student and son of Leopold Godowski, noted pianist and composer, was married in Harrison yesterday afternoon to Yvonne Evelyn Hughes, once a "Follies" girl and now with the movies. The ceremony was performed in the small court room of the Harrison Police Station by Justice of the Peace Cornelius J. Sullivan, who is station agent of the New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad in that town.

Accompanying the couple were Fred Kohlmar, 23 years old, of 3,708 Walnut Street, Philadelphia, and Miss Maxine Sickle, 22, of the Sylvania Hotel, Philadelphia, who were also married yesterday by Judge Sullivan.

Mrs. Madeline Miller and A. D. Gruskin were witnesses at both marriages.

According to information on the license young Mrs. Godowsky, whose age was given as 22, was divorced from a former husband on Nov. 8, 1920, in Pennsylvania. Mr. Godowsky is 23 years old.

Mr. Godowsky had been reported married on Feb. 11 and the next day his sister, Dagmar Godowsky, film star and former wife of Frank Mayo, film director, confirmed the report and said her family knew that he had been married secretly but did not know the name of his bride.

"All we know," she said at that time, "is that my brother suddenly left his studies and got married, and we presume that he is on his honeymoon. My father is of course surprised. He was in his senior year and planned to go to Oxford next year."

Neither Mr. nor Mrs. Leopold Godowsky could be reached last night at their home at the Park Central Hotel, but Miss Dagmar Godowsky said she knew nothing of Miss Hughes. She said that when she talked on Feb. 11 she thought the marriage already had taken place.
